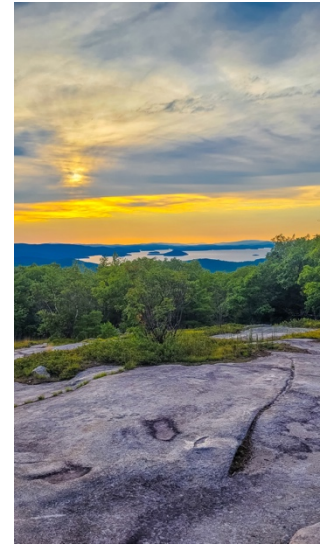

Despite all the record rain in July and unbearable heat in August, members of PMSC have been working hard to get our trails ready for the upcoming season. The crews have been diligently working in the Den over the last few months. A new trail around the lake has been roughed in & a new trail down Mt Caverly along with 100 yards of material spread on the roads. The big excavators have done all the heavy work, but we still need volunteers to drag branches and smaller rocks off the trails whenever possible. Our Summer Grant in Aid was approved for the bridge over the Ella River & a new drag. We hope to have a fundraising campaign to help cover our share of the drag. Improvements continue to reduce the incline of last year's emergency reroute in Farmington at River Road. Unfortunately, since we did not receive GIA to help improve last year's reroute, will have to cover the cost of improvements "out of pocket."



Construction of the new bridge is scheduled for September 10-12.
