Secretary's Report:

Ginny Abresch presented the November meeting minutes to the membership. Copies of the minutes were available on site and were also posted on the website for members to review prior to the meeting

Membership Report:

Membership director Deb McLaughlin sent in a report that there were 298 (124 Individual/174 Family) members to date via NHSA. Last year there were 259 memberships at this time. There were ~800 more memberships statewide this year due to the southern snow and surrounding clubs. With this membership count, we will have 3 delegates for the annual meeting.

Cash on hand: Checking account: \$26,676.26 and Capital fund - \$11,232.44 for a total of \$337,908.70. Income: \$2,975 from 50/50 raffle \$160-\$80 to club. Club raffle \$210, Poker Run \$1,385 - \$695 to club, \$690 to winner. Sign sponsors \$500, Winter Carnival Food \$1,673, NHSA Super Raffle \$745.24. Expenses: Fuel for groomers \$2,372, Northern groomer repair \$1,394.82 and Southern Groomer \$579.60.

Old Business:

Cookout was a big success. Thanks to all the volunteers who made it happen.

New Business:

This year County Directors are up for a vote. We nominated Nick Bickford for this position. The Snow Traveler Foundation is now a charitable 501C3; will offer scholarships, sign grants, etc. A new decal plate will be available with 5 digits and a snowmobile decal once approved by the DOT.
